研究院在香港中文大学（深圳）与深圳市前海深港现代服务业合作区管理局的联合支持下，立足深圳、放眼全球，由政治经济学家、香港中文大学（深圳）教授郑永年领衔，联合来自全球专业背景的专家学者，历经六年磨砺，已组建了一支30余人的团队，发布政策报告1000余篇，承接各类课题50余项，发表学术著作30余部，主办各类学术活动20余场，成长为一所专注于为区域及国家的战略发展提供政策分析、理论研究、人才培养、交流平台的思想重镇，国际影响力不断提升。

研究院于2023年获选中央财经委员会办公室首批十家重点智库信息联系单位，并于2025年入选中国社会科学评价研究院“中国智库综合评价研究项目AMI智库”名单，并成功入选“中国智库特色案例”和“中国智库参考案例”。

我们做什么

- 政策研究：提供决策咨询服务**

我们为政府、企业等决策者提供决策理论框架与可行性建议，以改善地方、国家、世界的政策与治理。我们累计报送政策报告千余篇，大量报告为中央和各级政府所采用。我们持续承接和推进来自政府、企业、高校等委托的重要课题，推进多个重点研究基地的建设，为中国制定相应的战略和政策提供理论和现实依据。
- 学术研究：建构自主知识体系**

我们的研究全部基于对关键全球问题的公正评估、对包容开放思想的承诺、对数据与事实的严谨调研，从而产生原创的、前沿的和客观的理论与分析。我们的研究从全球视角出发，聚焦中国政治经济学、国际关系与外交政策、全球发展与治理、经济与产业政策、科技创新与可持续发展、规则标准与涉外法治、企业出海和经济全球化、人工智能社会形态、海洋经济、粤港澳大湾区、南方共同市场等领域。

- 智库传播：深度洞见凝聚共识**

通过“媒体、网站、出版”传播矩阵，我们打破国际壁垒，向学界、政界和大众传播中国的声音、亚洲的声音和来自世界各地的声音。我们的自主新媒体品牌“大湾区评论”，致力于打造一个具有国际视野、提供深度内容的集权威性、前瞻性、多元性于一体的思想交流平台。我们的出版物如《单边开放》《中等技术陷阱》《产业政策变革》《深圳：第四次产业革命的摇篮》和《前海模式》等，解析国内与国际政策变化，洞见关键全球问题与现象。
- 政策培训：赋能未来人才培养**

我们与香港中文大学（深圳）公共政策学院形成智库与学院的有效互动与协同，助推政策研究与学术研究的深度融合和相互促进，通过设立IIA奖学金培养国际关系与公共政策方面的专业人才。我们举办以政策研究为主题的夏令营和专题培训项目，面向海内外优秀青年学子及年轻从业者展开深度研讨与实践互动，旨在激发下一代对政策研究的热情与兴趣，为未来国际事务和公共治理领域储备有理想、有视野、有担当的青年力量。

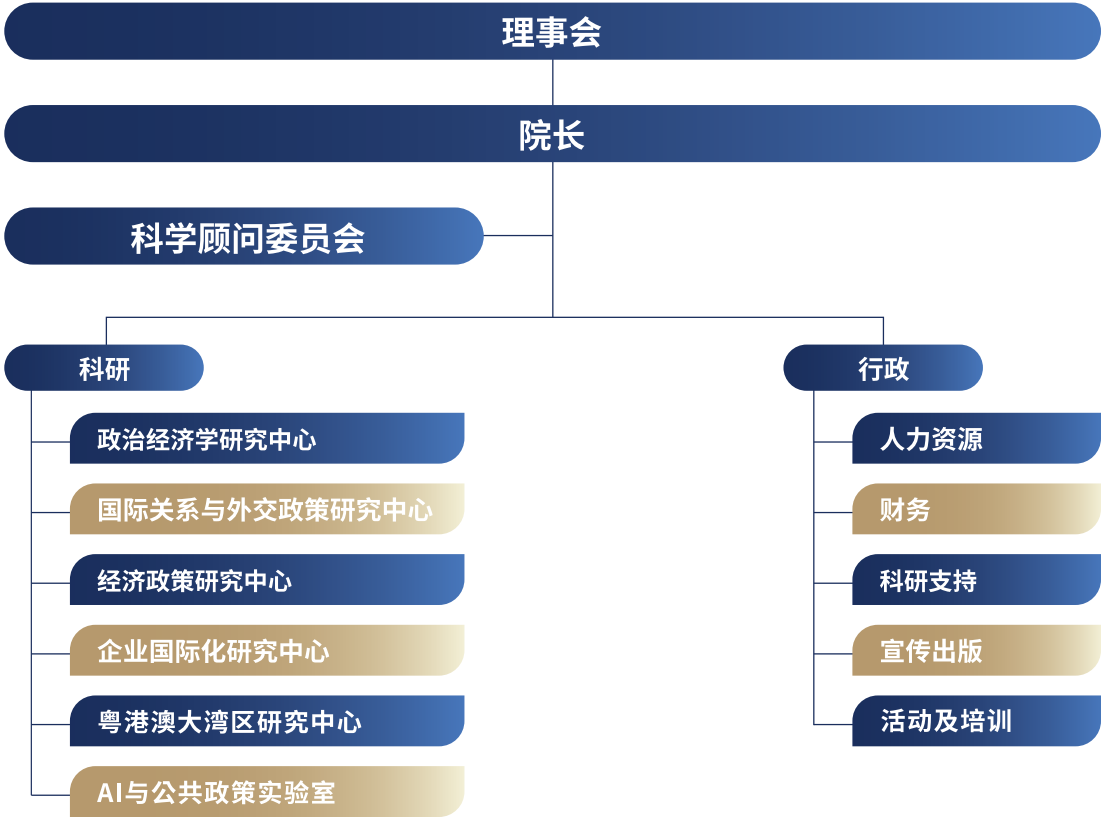

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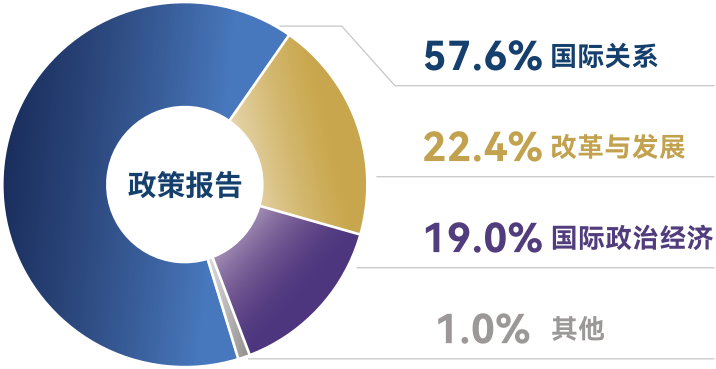

《IIA政策分析报告》

政策报告是我院为中央和地方各级政府提供决策建议的最重要产品之一，选题广涉外交内政：对外关注大国关系、国际冲突与合作等；对内关注经济发展、科技战略、人才建设等。本系列报告为内部期刊，兼具时政热度和学术深度，理性、深入地剖析全球与当代中国现状。



Asian Review of Political Economy

Asian Review of Political Economy（《亚洲政经评论》）是我院联合上海交通大学国际与公共事务学院和上海交通大学政治经济研究院主办的一本全英文学术期刊，由郑永年教授担任主编。本刊力求促进全方位理解亚洲及其他地区的政治经济，围绕传统和新兴的政治经济议题，鼓励跨学科研究，发表有理论创见和政策导向的研究成果。涵盖的主题包括但不限于发展、分配、金融、贸易、投资、产业和技术以及新兴的全球安全挑战。



中国科学院院刊《人工智能与未来社会》

当前，我国人工智能正由“技术突破”迈向“社会融入”新阶段，急需构建前瞻性制度体系、健全治理规则、推动资源要素优化配置，以实现技术发展与社会可持续的深度耦合。为此，《中国科学院院刊》策划组织“人工智能与未来社会”专题，专题由香港中文大学(深圳)前海国际事务研究院院长郑永年教授指导并携其团队共同推进。系统聚焦人工智能发展对社会结构、治理机制、经济模式与国际格局的多维影响，汇聚社会、政策、科技、经济等跨学科专家，形成理论探索与政策研判并重、技术视角与社会关切兼顾的研究合力，本专题收录文章共 9 篇。本专题文章从理论建构、制度设计、风险治理到战略布局，系统探讨了人工智能技术演进与社会变迁之间的双向互动，展现了多学科融合、多维度推进的研究新趋势。期待通过专题的探讨，为我国准确把握人工智能塑造未来社会的深层逻辑、完善前瞻性政策体系提供有力支撑，推动中国在全球智能文明的演进中由参与者迈向引领者的战略转型。



《论单边开放》

在逆全球化浪潮汹涌、美国对华打压围堵持续升级的今天，传统多边合作框架正加速失效，国际秩序面临系统性解体，全球局势陷入巨大的不确定性。《论单边开放》直面这一时代剧变，从中国内外部环境的结构性变化及人工智能革命的背景出发，首次提出并系统阐释“单边开放”战略的内涵要义、理论逻辑、对中国自身发展以及全球治理的巨大意义，同时冷静剖析进一步实施所面临的现实挑战及应对之策。作者提出，单边开放是一种主动、包容又灵活的战略选择，它不是对西方规则的全盘接受，亦非狭隘的独善其身，而是一种以自主改革推动国际博弈的破局思维，是当下中国应对全球化逆流，在复杂国际环境下实现国家自主发展与国际合作辩证统一的关键战略与创新实践。本书于今年6月由浙江人民出版社出版。



《中等技术陷阱：经济持续增长的关键挑战》

中国改革开放所取得的伟大成就，很大程度上依赖于内部现代化和外部全球化的互相加持，但面对当下外部环境随时发生重大变化的现状，如何实现高质量发展，完成下一阶段现代化的目标，已成为摆在我们面前的课题。在此背景下，郑永年教授及其团队基于国际和国内发展经验与教训，通过对欧美、亚洲的日本和“四小龙”（韩国、新加坡、中国台湾、中国香港）发达经济体以及拉美与亚洲那些长期陷入中等收入陷阱的经济体的比较分析，创新性地提出“中等技术陷阱”概念。本书对“中等技术陷阱”展开详细论述，指出在科技进步层面，中国想要跨越“中等技术陷阱”的发展逻辑，为未来经济建设和发展提供可行性思路。本书由中信出版社出版。



《“前海模式”：改革、开放、创新与中国式现代化》

前海是中国式现代化的一个最有代表性、最具典型意义的鲜活案例。“前海模式”是高质量发展的“新三大法宝”——改革、开放、创新的生动实践。前海深港现代服务业合作区作为新时代国家级重大战略平台，如何依托香港、服务内地、面向世界，为中国式现代化贡献力量，是一个重大而现实的课题。本书从制度创新驱动发展、中央与地方联动、现代服务业新体系建设、深化深港合作以及前海新城建设等方面出发，展现前海十余年来改革、开放与创新的全景。由“前海模式”破题，以中国式现代化的全面实现为点睛之笔，为讲好“前海故事”提供重要经验与启示。本书由中国社会科学出版社出版。



《深圳2035：中国式现代化的深圳展望》

在本书中，郑永年教授携团队提出要建设“地域嵌入型”国际经济平台，探讨新发展阶段、新发展理念、新发展格局背景下社会主义现代化的基本内涵及深圳的历史使命，深度剖析社会主义现代化指标体系的构建和实现社会主义现代化路径的国际经验，聚焦国际、国家、大湾区和深圳发展四层面阐释深圳对中国式现代化的重要意义，展现中国在世界百年未有之大变局中的大国担当。本书由深圳出版社出版。

APEC与全球主要经济体改革动态分析（月报）

今天，世界正处于一个高度不确定的历史进程中。全球政治经济格局加速重构，新一轮科技革命和产业变革持续演进，主要国家改革步伐显著提速，制度优化日益成为国际竞争的核心要素。在这一充满挑战与机遇的关键周期，准确研判国际发展趋势、深入理解主要国家改革路径，对于提升中国的战略判断力与政策制定能力具有重要意义。

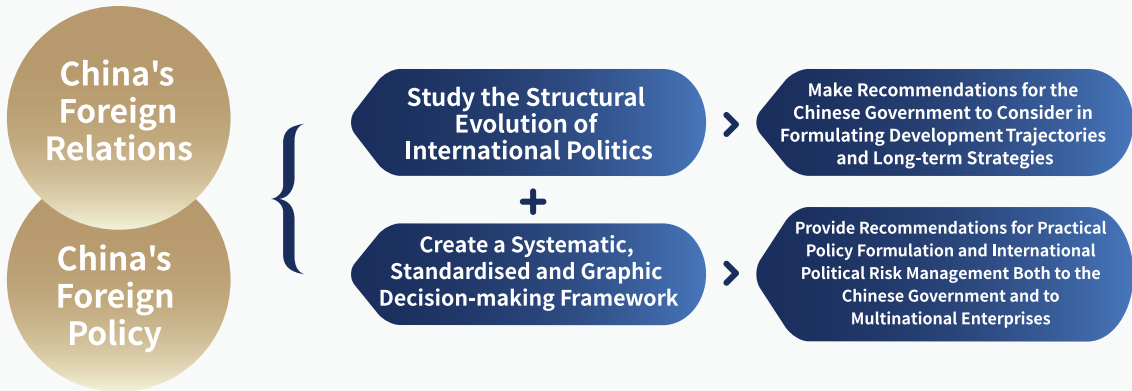

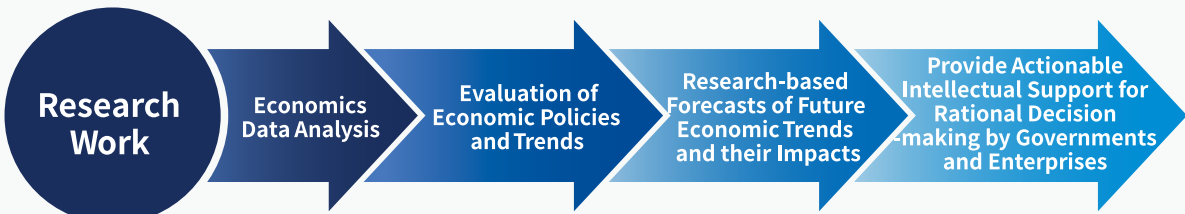

Driven by China's high-level institutional opening-up, the "Belt and Road Initiative," and the dual circulation strategy, the globalization of Chinese enterprises is entering a new phase, characterized by the ambition to establish themselves as multinational corporations. Going global has transitioned from being an optional strategy for some companies to a necessity, with certain industries facing an urgent reality of "go global or be left behind." As more Chinese enterprises participate in international markets, the complexities of managing cross-border operations and risk management have grown significantly. On the one hand, they must navigate diverse market challenges, including cross-cultural management, brand building, talent acquisition, and legal compliance. On the other, profound changes in global geopolitical dynamics and domestic politics in host countries have intensified the impact of non-economic factors such as trade disputes, unilateral sanctions, and local political risks on overseas business operations. These developments compel enterprises to enhance their political acumen and their ability to address non-commercial challenges.

To address this evolving landscape, the Institute has established the Centre for Enterprise Internationalization. The Centre integrates resources from policy research, government, and industry to provide Chinese enterprises with a platform for advocacy, in-depth research, and exchange. It also offers policy advice to government bodies at all levels and fosters the rapid development of related domestic research fields, thereby supporting the internationalization of Chinese enterprises and aligning with national strategic objectives.

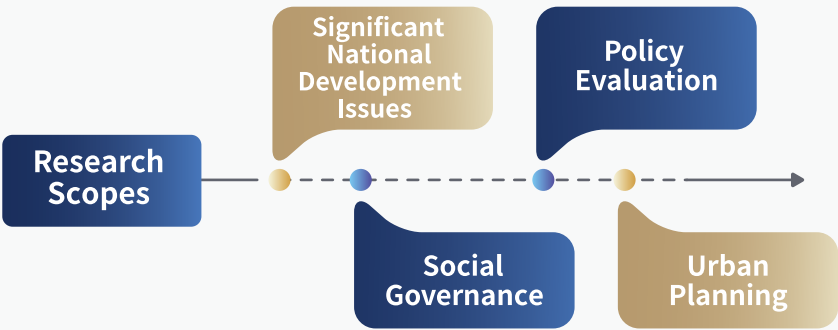

AI AND PUBLIC POLICY LABORATORY



The AI and Public Policy Laboratory is a policy-and-technology think tank jointly established and operated by the Institute for International Affairs, Qianhai and the School of Artificial Intelligence at The Chinese University of Hong Kong, Shenzhen. The Laboratory operates under a co-directorship model, with the heads of both founding institutions jointly overseeing its research agenda and major strategic decisions. Bringing together policy specialists from the Institute for International Affairs, Qianhai and AI experts from the School of Artificial Intelligence at The Chinese University of Hong Kong, Shenzhen, the Laboratory focuses on interdisciplinary research at the intersection of artificial intelligence and public policy. Its key research areas include:

AI and Geopolitics: strategic competition and dynamics among major AI powers; the evolution of global AI governance; and comparative studies of multilateral AI cooperation mechanisms.

AI and Area Studies: national AI strategies and regulatory frameworks; comparative regional AI governance models; AI technological hegemony and strategic responses by middle powers.

AI and Technology and Industrial Policy: AI innovation ecosystems and industry trends; regional AI industry development pathways; and the security of AI industrial and supply chains.

AI and Data Governance: market-oriented allocation of data as a factor of production; data rights and data circulation rules; regulation of cross-border data flows; and institutional frameworks for data security and privacy protection.

The Laboratory regularly publishes policy briefs, commentary, and research reports, including the weekly *AI International Political Economy Watch (News Brief)*, the weekly *Geotechnology Review*, the monthly *AI International Political Economy Watch*, and thematic research reports.

Professor Zheng graduated from Peking University (BA in International Relations, 1985; MA in Political Theory, 1988) and Princeton University (MA in Political Science, 1992; PhD, 1995). He was a Lecturer in the Department of Politics and Public Administration of Peking University (1988-1990); Research Fellow and Senior Research Fellow of the East Asian Institute, National University of Singapore (1997-2005); Professor and Research Director of the China Policy Institute, University of Nottingham (2005-2008); Professor and Director of the East Asian Institute, National University of Singapore (2008-2020). He was a Fellow of the US Social Science Research Council-MacArthur Foundation (1995-1997) and a John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation Fellow (1998-2000).

Professor Zheng’s main research interests are international relations, China’s foreign policy, China’s domestic transformation and its external impact. He has authored and edited some one hundred books, including more than a dozen monographs in English. He has published numerous research papers in academic journals.

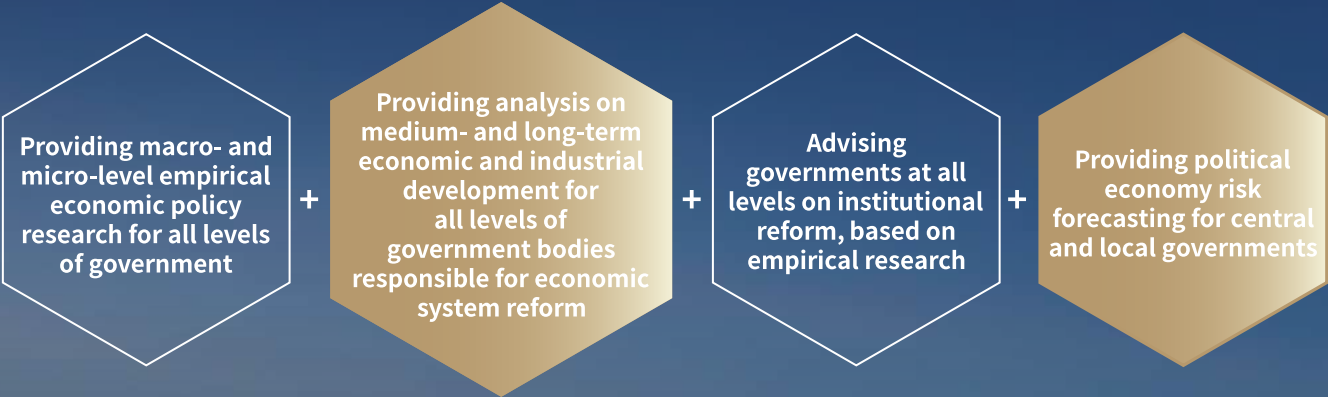

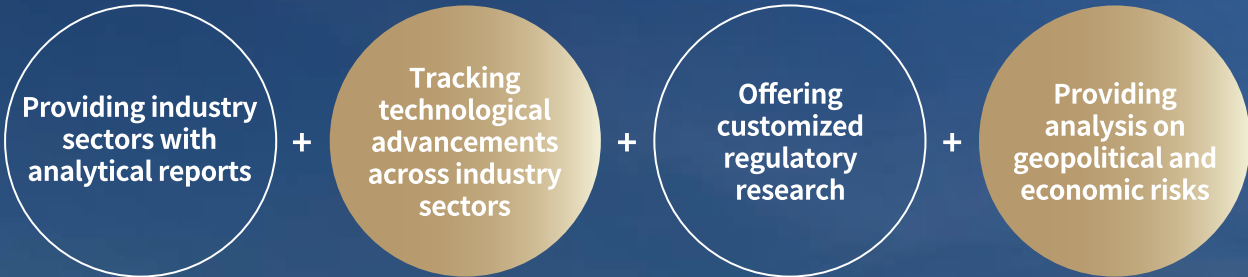

Bulletin of the Chinese Academy of Sciences: AI and Future Society

Currently, artificial intelligence in China is transitioning from a phase of "technological breakthroughs" to a new stage of "societal integration". This shift urgently requires the establishment of a forward-looking institutional framework, the refinement of governance rules, and the optimization of resource allocation to achieve deep interplay between technological advancement and social sustainability. To this end, the Bulletin of the Chinese Academy of Sciences has curated a special issue titled "Artificial Intelligence and Future Society". Through this thematic exploration, the issue aims to provide robust support for China in accurately grasping the underlying logic through which AI shapes the future society, refining forward-looking policy systems, and advancing the nation's strategic transition from a participant to a leader in the evolution of global intelligent civilization.



On Unilateral Opening-up:

Amid today's surging deglobalization tides and escalating U.S. containment against China, traditional multilateral frameworks are rapidly eroding, and the international order faces systemic disintegration, with global situation plunging into profound uncertainty. Confronting this epochal transformation, On Unilateral Opening pioneers the "unilateral opening" strategy—rooted in China's shifting domestic/external landscapes and the AI revolution—systematically articulating its conceptual core, theoretical foundations, and transformative significance for China's development and global governance, while objectively analyzing implementation challenges and solutions. The author defines unilateral opening as a proactive, inclusive, and flexible strategic choice. It transcends both wholesale adoption of Western rules and isolationist self-preservation, embodying instead a game-changing paradigm: leveraging self-driven reforms to recalibrate global engagement. This approach represents China's core strategy and innovative practice for navigating counter-globalization currents while achieving the dialectical unity of autonomous development and international cooperation within complex geopolitical realities. The book was published by Zhejiang People's Publishing House in June 2025.



"Qianhai Model": Reform, Opening-up, Innovation, and Chinese Modernization

Qianhai stands as one of the most representative and emblematic live cases of Chinese-style modernization. The "Qianhai Model" vividly demonstrates the three key drivers of high-quality development -- reform, openness, and innovation. As a major national strategic platform for the new era, the Qianhai Shenzhen-Hong Kong Modern Service Industry Cooperation Zone explores how to leverage Hong Kong, serve the Mainland, and engage with the world, contributing to Chinese-style modernization. This book offers a panoramic view of Qianhai's reform, openness, and innovation over the past decade, covering aspects such as institutional-innovation-driven development, central-local coordination, the construction of a new modern service industry system, deepening Shenzhen-Hong Kong cooperation, and the development of the Qianhai new area. IIA SCHOLARSHIP



INTRODUCTION

To attract young talented people with cross-disciplinary background to be devoted to public policy research, the Institute provides the **IIA Scholarship** to support the qualified Postgraduate or Ph.D. candidates of CUHK-Shenzhen.

The candidates who have successfully gained the IIA scholarship will be entitled as “**IIA Fellow**” .

APPLICATION PROCESS

The applicant shall go through the process below to apply for IIA Scholarship.
Candidate who has passed all the process will sign a formal agreement with the Institute.

Program

Who can apply	Candidates who have received an offer from The Chinese University of Hong Kong, Shenzhen, and have decided to pursue a Postgraduate or PhD degree at the University. (Those who have received full funding from other programs are not eligible for this funding)
Type	Full scholarship, half scholarship and stipend. (The type of funding will be determined based on a comprehensive evaluation by the committee)
Duration of scholarship	For postgraduate students, it is the same duration as the normative studying period of the program; for Ph.D. candidates, it is normally 3 years, no more than 4 years, paid in installments by semester or academic year.
Other requirements	IIA Scholarship recipients shall provide research-related services to the Institute for the duration of the grant. Detailed responsibilities will be stated on the IIA Scholarship Agreement between the Institute and recipient.

Online Application

- The applicant should carefully read the scholarship handbook of the year published by the Institute, and submit all the materials that are required. The applicant shall be responsible for the authenticity of the materials.

Preliminary Screening by the Institute

- The Institute will inform the candidates who have passed the preliminary screening for an interview by the IIA committee.

Interview by the IIA Committee

- The final results will be sent to the candidate's program director for approval first, and then to the IIA Director for final approval.

- Applicants have strong policy analysis ability and solid scientific research ability, and those with high-quality publication records are preferred;
- There is no age limit for applicants, and those who have participated in or presided over major government projects and written development reports are preferred;
- Able to use both Chinese and English proficiently as the working language to write research papers and policy reports.
